THE WORK OF ALICE BOUGHTON

Alice Boughton is a well known artist photographer of New York. Her work has appeared in exhibitions in this country and abroad. She has received medals and honorable mention at photographic shows in London, Paris, Vienna, Turin and other cities.

Miss Boughton first studied painting and then decided to try photography as a means of art-expression. Her earliest work was with nude figures out of doors, and she has done much unusual and beautiful work in this direction. Later she made pictures of gardens, and her most important work in this line is a set of seventy-five views of the gardens of the Rockefeller estate at Tarrytown. Three of these are here shown.

Alice Boughton is now a constant contributor to current periodicals with portraits of well-known people and theatrical groups.

Her principal work is that of portrait photographer. Among her sitters she has had many well-known men and women of this country and Europe.

A most important part of a photographer's equipment, besides knowledge of technique and artistic feeling, is ability to get on with people and to bring out their happiest expressions. Miss Boughton has had many entertaining experiences in the process of making some of her sitters unbend and feel at their ease in the face of the relentless camera.

Several processes are shown in this exhibition, gum prints, platinum and bromide prints and a few platinum prints on Japanese tissue paper.
